# ROYAL BOTANIC GARDENS KEW

The Palm House is an iconic Victorian glasshouse and indoor rainforest within the world-renowned Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew.

Its high-traffic heritage setting required durable pathways that complemented the natural landscape.

Designers required a surface that was durable, long-lasting, and visually sympathetic to the surroundings, avoiding the harshness of traditional black asphalt while coping with high footfall.

### Solution

NatraTex Cotswold was selected to create pathways that combine the strength of asphalt with the appearance of natural stone. Approximately 500m<sup>2</sup> of surfacing was installed, delivering a robust, low-maintenance finish suitable for both pedestrian and light vehicular use.

### Outcome

The completed pathways deliver a high-quality finish that enhances the visitor experience while standing up to heavy usage. The result is a natural-looking, durable surface suitable for one of the UK's most iconic heritage sites.
